EDCP 329 focuses on agriculture in the curriculum. This is a one-week summer institute with pre- and post-assignments offered in Abbotsford in partnership with British Columbia Agriculture in the Classroom Foundation. Candidates must have a recognized Master's degree, and at least 5 years of teaching in a school setting. The successful candidate should have a strong background in teaching about agriculture, food production and environmental issues at all school levels, experience in teaching adults, practical knowledge and experience in farming, agriculture, and the agri-food industry, an interest in an interest in current research in education and food production, and a willingness to work in partnership with BC AITC.
