The Department of Curriculum and Pedagogy has opportunity for one part-time instructor position in the Vancouver Summer Program. We are accepting applications for the following course:

Package: **The Style and Culture of Food**
Course 1: Eating food – an everyday experience
Course 2: Thoughtful eating in a Globalized World

Meeting Dates: July 15 – August 10, 2017 (mostly Monday – Thursday)
Meeting Times: 3hr/day x 15 days per course

These non-credit courses are designed to provide international students with opportunities to learn academic topics and gain cultural experiences. Applicants must have a minimum of a Bachelor of Education and Red Seal accreditation (or equivalent) with relevant teaching experience and academic expertise and be prepared to work with and under the guidance of the responsible faculty member. They should be familiar with both theoretical and practical learning about food, sustainability, and influences on eating patterns. Duties include teaching, site excursions, holding regular office hours, marking assignments, consensus marking meetings, reporting grades, attending planning and debriefing meetings.
