The Department of Curriculum and Pedagogy and the Teacher Education Office at the University of British Columbia invite applications from experienced teacher educators with expertise in Music for a twelve-month, part-time (60%) seconded teacher position commencing in September 2015 with the possibility of renewal for up to two additional years. The successful candidate will work with teacher candidates in the Arts-Based & Creativity Cohort (ABC). Practica will take place in two lower mainland school districts.

Candidates must have a master's degree, at least 5 years of teaching in a school setting, experience acting as school advisor for teacher candidates, excellent communication skills and a disposition toward inquiry. Extensive background in teaching Music at the elementary level is essential. Vocal or instrumental experience may be desirable.

The successful candidate will be expected to provide leadership in the cohort and in the undergraduate program. Responsibilities will include teaching the Inquiry Seminar/s and Music Education Curriculum and Instruction courses. The position will also include supervision of teacher candidates and some administrative duties involving the elementary and/or secondary Music Education program.
