The fee is non-refundable and is valid for only one academic year (May to January start dates). **Applications received without the fee will not be processed.** For online application the fee must be paid with a credit card or Interac with Scotiabank, Royal Bank, TD Canada Trust or Bank of Montreal. If you do not have access to a credit card nor Interac with any of the above institutions, please email Graduate and Postdoctoral Studies for further instruction at graduate.apply@ubc.ca.

_____ A statement of intent which addresses your specific interests in pursuing this degree.

_____ A curriculum vitae (resumé) which includes your professional employment experience.

_____ **Three references**, either on the official form, in a letter on a letterhead, or online (if available), including an assessment by at least one university instructor. Ph.D. applicants should have, an assessment from the master's thesis research supervisor. In not submitted directly online, these references must be received by Curriculum and Pedagogy sealed and endorsed from the issuer.

Please upload your **official transcripts** from all colleges and universities previously or currently attended. If the official transcript does not indicate the degree name and the degree conferral date, then **upload** degree certificate as well. All transcripts from non-English speaking countries must be accompanied by official certified English translations. If you are offered admission, you will be required to send in one copy of each of your official academic history documents. Official documents are normally sent to:

For Ph.D. students only:

_____ A sample of your scholarly writing. This could be an excerpt of a research paper or your thesis, preferably **10-20 pages in length**.

For Canadians who have completed all tertiary education outside Canada only:

_____ Evidence of Canadian citizenship in the form of a passport or birth certificate copy.

For Permanent Canadian Residents (Landed Immigrants) only:

_____ Permanent Residents are required to provide proof of immigration status and date of landing by submitting a copy of the Record of Landing Form or a copy of both the front and back of their Permanent Resident card

For International students only:

_____ If your transcripts (and certificates) are in a language other than English or French, you must include official certified English translations.

_____ TOEFL (Test of English as a Foreign Language). Applicants from a university outside Canada in which English is not the primary language of instruction must present evidence of competency to pursue studies in the English language prior to being extended an offer of admission. A satisfactory TOEFL score of **at least 580 on PBT, 237 on CBT, and 92 on IBT – minimum 22 on each component** is required before any offer of admission is made. Score reports more than two years old will not be accepted. TOEFL test takers can request electronic submission of scores to universities. We accept electronic delivery directly from the test centre to UBC only. For all other tests an official paper test score report ordered from the testing agency is required. Photocopies of test scores are not acceptable.

Applications cannot be processed until all the required documentation has been received.
