## EDCP Graduate Programs by the Numbers

In 2020, 371 students currently enrolled, including 39 MA, 260 MEd and 72 PhD students | 24 per cent of students in our department are international students | The Faculty of Education and the Faculty of Graduate + Postdoctoral Studies provide over \$400 000 CAD in scholarship funding each year | Annual travel awards available to support student involvement in conferences and events.

**The PhD in Curriculum Studies** is a flexible, research-oriented doctoral program designed for students interested in the organization of learning within educational settings. Students typically devote two years to coursework, and two to three years to developing and carrying out a research project designed to make an original contribution to knowledge in the area of specialization.

Master's students may apply to any of the programs listed here: art education, curriculum studies, health, outdoor & physical education, home economics education, mathematics education, media & technology studies education, museum education, music education, science education and social studies education. We offer fully face-to-face, blended and fully online programs.

## Admissions

Graduate and Postdoctoral Studies establishes common minimum admission requirements. Each subject area or program may have additional requirements. Please refer to our program website for details.

## Financial Support

Financial support for graduate students typically comes from one or more of four basic sources: merit-based awards administered by Graduate and Postdoctoral Studies, teaching and research assistantships, need-based awards and direct awards from external agencies.
