The Department of Curriculum and Pedagogy has opportunity for a part-time Sessional Lecturer. We are accepting applications for the following course:

EDCP 562 61B (Flexible Learning) Curriculum Issues and Theories (3 credits)

This graduate course is a required course for students enrolled in a Masters of Education (M.Ed) in mathematics education cohort. The theme of the cohort is Teaching and Learning Mathematics with/in Community. EDCP 562 examines the purposes and justifications of curriculum theory and implications for practice. The course provides opportunities for students to explore possibilities and applications of curriculum studies for mathematics education in place and connected to community and culture.

Mode of Delivery: Online

Requires In-Person Attendance: No

No Scheduled Meetings – however regular Zoom class meetings (about every 2 weeks) are encouraged and are optional for enrolled students.

Applicants must have a minimum of a recognized doctoral degree, recent and relevant teaching and academic expertise for this graduate course. Applicants should have:

- experience in the K-12 and post-secondary education system
- experience with research in curriculum studies
- experience with research and/or teaching in the fields of place-based education, Indigenous education, and culture and mathematics education is preferred.

Duties include teaching, holding regular office hours, marking assignments, reporting grades, attending subject area meetings as well as follow-up appointments, where applicable.

Equity and diversity are essential to academic excellence. An open and diverse community fosters the inclusion of voices that have been underrepresented or discouraged. We encourage applications from members of groups that have been marginalized on any grounds enumerated under the B.C. Human Rights Code, including sex, sexual orientation, gender identity or expression, racialization, disability, political belief, religion, marital or family status, age, and/or status as a First Nation, Metis, Inuit, or Indigenous person.

All qualified candidates are encouraged to apply; however Canadians and permanent residents will be given priority.
